[GVBCH Christmas Dinner Meeting by Jim Gould, 'The Picket Line' reporter *Bozeman*—At approximately 7:30 o'clock, December 14, 2002, two-term President Brown Parsons convened the Christmas dinner meeting of the Gallatin Valley Back country Horsemen in a Kountry Corner Cafe' dining room full to the corners. And the evening ended as it began with the right people getting elected and *re*-elected, good down-home, homegrown entertainment, and immense credit and gratitude to the outstanding members who contributed so much to the mission and enjoyment of GVBCH.

With Jiffy Hale and Bettye White officiating the election of officers and board, Brown Parsons—yes, the same!—is elected President for his *third* term, with great thanks of the entire organization! Ron Rassley, equally applauded, is Vice President. Joan Holborn did too good a job in '02 as Secretary, which has earned her yet another term and opportunity to be part of the leadership team of GVBCH. And Bettye White, the real range rider of the club, is taking over as Treasurer from Sammylu Parsons, whose careful handling of finances is greatly appreciated.

The Board of Directors is now rounded out with Sharon Lowry (more about her later), Joyce Haner, and Jim Nelson—complemented by members continuing their terms on the board, Bonnie Hammer, Rich Inman and Aaron Linton. David Read, a write-in candidate, proclaimed in his nominating speech, "I really want to come to more meetings but what do I have to do?" He was also overheard complimenting Chick Hale that he had never seen him look—or smell--so good. Wally Becker later attributed the compliment to Read's better eyesight than sense of smell. In addition, Linda Roffe, Harry Boughton and Alternate Ron Rassley will once again ably represent GVBCH at the State Board.

The most notable GVBCH achievement of the year was honored by the presence once again this year of prominent leaders of the U.S. Forest Service and their families—Jose' Castro, District Ranger, Gallatin National Forest; Brian McNeil, Manager of Roads and Trails; and Will Shoutis, a new Trail Foreman in 2002. The service expressed their great appreciation and credit to all the GVBCH trail clearing and building crews for their tremendous effort and achievement this year, the most ever accomplished: 220 riding horses, 105 packhorses, and 1,980 hours of work for a total of 1,731 miles all producing more than 3,000' of rebuilt trails. Trail crew chiefs Chick Hale and Wally Becker were particularly honored with beautifully embroidered U.S. Forest Service/Back Country Horsemen saddle pads. In addition, the service awarded the club an official forest service certificate of appreciation, noting that it is the best group they have worked with. Chick recalled how very far the club's relationship with the service has evolved to the present one of honor and gratitude by the service. Brown capped the awards with an urgent appeal to have every able-bodied member put in at least one day next summer on trail clearing or building.

The President's trophy for outstanding member service was awarded to both Bill Shields, who led the Bridger crew and Sharon Lowry, who not only wrote, edited, produced and mailed *The Picket Line*, but also organized and supervised the annual Poker Ride. *Two* members, Jiffy Hale and Dan Marsh have graciously agreed to take over her position as editor this year, and, thankfully, Sharon will continue to serve on the board.

The awarding and successful fulfillment of a weed control grant to GVBCH was led this year and last by Tom Griffith, who reported receiving \$5,000 for global positioning system equipment and the contribution of \$5,700 in club effort and hours. The evening's entertainment was ably passed from Beth Merrick to George Watson, who mc'd many glorious new renditions of old well-known tunes by the club's own beautifully decorated Reindeerettes (Beth, Bonnie, Karen, Sammylu and Sharon) a sampling of which follows:
