Trail Report

Chick Hale reports the following trail clearing activity for the month of July:

Larry Thomas and Wally Becker packed equipment into Cottonwood for the Forest Service.

Dan Porter and Wally Becker did work on Deer Creek mid-month.

The Forest Service patched road ruts in the Spanish Creek road.

Larry Thomas, Billie Thomas, Brenda Kessler, Jim Allbright, Wally Becker and Chick Hale manicured 141 feet of Garnet Mountain trail in two hours and nearly melted.

With the fire season arriving and temperatures soring, it is imperative that trail workers contact trail bosses in the event that rides have to be cancelled. Wally recommends cancelling work parties when temperatures reach 85 degrees or more.

coffee pot for the club as the old one is worn out. The Board approved this purchase.



Successful 2006 Poker Ride


- 173 Registrations

- 180 Pops (15 twelve packs)




Bettye White estimates that \$3,100 was received, and about \$1,000 expended, netting the club \$2,100.

Suggestions for the 2007 Poker Ride include:

Trail

2007 Poker Ride The route will be the northern loop that will be traveled in a counter-clockwise direction.

Two Color Flagging A combination of two colors, used together, will denote the BCH trail and prevent riders from becoming confused when encountering tape or markers from other trails or projects.

Registration

Price Panel Meal only, Adult and Child ride registration fees, 50/50 Pot price and Membership costs should be visible on a sign before paying so that one check can cover all expenses selected.

50/50 Pot Riders will purchase a ticket for each 50/50 Pot hand that they will hand to the 50/50 Pot handler.

Meal Tickets Add a separate ticket for purchase of lunch only (no raffle or poker hands).

Trail Flagging Information Add flagging color descriptions to the Registration handout and have a sign demonstrating flagging materials at the trail departure point.

Speed Up Registration Double up on the number of registration tables/workers/pens/raffle cans.

Signing

Whoa and Giddyup Signs Mark the trail entrance with a sign showing where the trail starts, and add a "do not enter" sign to prevent riders from taking the trail in the wrong direction.

Children

Trail Cookies Add a bag of cookies for each kid would keep kids going through a 2-3 hour ride.

Kid Prize An age appropriate raffle prize for children riding the trail.

Donations

Blanks Add more blanks to the prize board for late

donations and have extra blank certificates available.

Food

Diet Drinks Riders prefer diet drinks to regular pop by a ration of 2:1 and our stock on hand should reflect this preference.

Alternatives Foods should be available as an alternative for riders who don't eat chicken or are vegetarians.


Desserts Serve finger foods like brownies or cookies that do not require paper plates or service.

Ice Chest Only one king-sized cooler is needed at Headquarters, since it can be refilled as needed.

Breakfast Delete breakfast service and provide two dozen muffins and coffee for workers only.

Watermellons Only eight watermellons are needed.
