Safety First, by Dave Moore of the Flathead BCH

The BCH of the Flathead adopted these guidelines in April '97 to follow during club events:

- 1. Project Leader should be aware of what communications are available and their location (radio, cell phone, etc.)
- 2. Project Leader should be aware of what first aid supplies are on hand and their location. They should also be aware of any first aid training or experience their crew members may have.
- 3. Project Leader should have a plan of action on how to get an injured person(s) to medical help.
- 4. For safety, at least two persons should be on a work project. This will also help to prevent body strain. Use of a chain saw will require two persons at all times.
- 5. Trail Work Practice safety with axes, saws, shovels, etc. Always be alert of your surroundings, including behind you and overhead.
- 6. Vehicle and Trailer Safety on the road, in camp, and in work areas When backing or parking, use lights or a guide when needed. Consider other vehicles, camps, and stock access when you park.
- 7. USING COMMON SENSE, COURTESY, SAFETY AND A SMILE WILL MAKE FOR A GOOD TIME FOR ALL!

The steak ride is coming up in August and I want to thank Dan Porter and Wally Becker for stepping forward to chair that event. If you can offer them any assistance I'm sure it would be appreciated.

MID-WEEK TRAIL CLEARING by Chick Hale

We have put together a summer program for clearing blow downs and cleaning water bars on our trails under the direction of the Forest Service.

With four leaders we would like to undertake four days of work per week as follows:

Monday - Rich Inman 388-1564

Tuesday - Wally Becker 587-9607

Wednesday - Chick Hale 763-4105

Thursday - Larry Thomas 586-6878

Call the leader for the day that suits you. Please call 2 to 3 days or more in advance of the work day. We have a list of 26 trails that the Forest Service would like us to open up for summer travel. The particular trail will be determined by its importance and ability of you folks. However, please note that Larry Thomas has agreed to work on wilderness trails and his work will require a hand saw.

Those interested in experiencing our trails in the Gallatin will find this an exciting opportunity to learn your mountains.

Saturday work on our adopted Spanish Creek Trail will occur as per our club schedule.



Gallatin Valley BCH began Saturday, May 12th on their first day of trail work. We had our Spanish Creek work day and a very successful one at that. Members included Wally our trail boss, Chick Hale, Kay Tate, Brenda Kessler, Jim Albright, Larry Thomas, Dan Porter, Dave Andreassi, Mary Kay Flanagan, Dan Marsh, Jiffie Hale, and Rich Inman and 2

pack horses.
Rich started out on foot to do

water bars. A number of blow downs were cleared and water bars cleaned. Chick and I headed back to the trail head after lunch while the rest worked their way up to the junction and a bit beyond towards Mirror Lake. There were about 30 trees of various sizes removed and that crew stayed out till the job was done. They were tired; they worked their butts off!

On Tuesday, May 15th Larry started up Hell Roaring - North Fork - taking just a small saw and cleared blow downs to approximately 2

miles from Thompson Lake and stopped because of snow.



Then on Thursday, May 17th Larry and his crew of Wally, Kay, Ron Rassley and Ed Long (both past members) cleared many blow downs to nine mile bridge. They took one pack horse.

Big time again on Saturday May 19th when two crews, each with a pack horse, and from opposite ends, met in the middle. At one end Larry and his great-grand-daughter, Lexis Ward, Wally, Ron and Kay drove into the Sourdough trail to the cut-off trail to Mystic Lake and met the other crew of Dan Marsh, Brenda and Jim who left from New World Gulch end. Brenda counted 60 various sized trees they had cut. They met the other crew and worked about a mile on and then a bad thunderstorm struck. Each crew had to ride back to their respective trailheads and were they tired! It was a long day and a successful one. They did not quit till the whole trail was accomplished. They were tired, but felt good on their job well done.

Since then the weather has been uncooperative and everyone needed the rest. They were glad to have worked when the ground was not dried up.

After lunch we circled around the a big knob then headed down another draw to the water tank where all the horses could gas up. It was here at the water tank that we learned to appreciate the wind. There was almost no wind at the tank and the little face flies were busy.

All in all it was a good trip for conditioning soft horses and riders. My thanks to Larry Thomas for riding drag.

Wilsall Ranch Ride, by Janice Cartwright, trail boss

On Saturday, May 5th, we had a great turn out for our beginner/conditioning trail ride at Ron Laden's ranch at the base of the Crazy Mountains. 23 riders attended, even though the weather started out looking cold, wet and windy. Our luck held, the rain moved out and so did we. This was open riding with large vistas of the Bridger, Absorka (or is that Beartooths?) and the Crazy Mountain Ranges. We had a few water/boggy areas to cross, (Susan Waddel provided the entertainment at these spots.), some

hills to climb up and down, badger holes to avoid, stops for photo shoots and ranch gates to be opened and a resident yearling moose to watch.

Open ranch riding is different from trail riding because you do not have to stay in a single file line. This gave everyone a chance to ride beside different partners and socialize a bit. The horses socialized too, giving some a good opportunity to inform their horses that they were to remember their manners. Those on gaited horses or horses that just wanted to move out were able to do so in appropriate places. There were some good discussions on horse behavior and tack during the ride.



Afterwards, many of the riders stayed for a potluck cook out in the barnyard. Sitting around the campfire, eating s'mores and enjoying the aroma of Chick's pipe completed a good day.

Gallatin River Ranch ride, by Nancy Winget

On Sunday, May 27th Janice lead a group of 24 members on a "ranch ride" on Gallatin River Ranch. The ride was delayed as Janice and others helped rescue horses from a trailer that had partially overturned in a ditch. A reminder to all of

us that driving horse trailers, regardless of size, takes skill and awareness. I am sure that the horses and

owners are appreciative of those who volunteered to rescue the horses.

The ride was an easy, early season conditioning ride. Even the weather accommodated the group - the threatened rain storms held off until the ride was over and all were safely on their way home. Riders varied in skill from those that have ridden trails for years to some of us that are fairly inexperienced riders. Horses ranged from Wayne's new little

three year old on her first ride outside the round pen, Chick's new 3 ½ yo, Pistol Pete, on his first trail ride, to Jiffie's been there done that 30 year old Appy. This ride was a

great experience for all, and no, we didn't see any rattlesnakes!

We took a short break on top of one hill to enjoy views of the mountains and valley, adjust cinches and

take pictures. Janice snapped one of everyone who was interested with the beautiful background.

Many of the riders had been on the Virginia City Poker Ride the day before, and I couldn't help but make comparisons to our ride when

hearing their stories. Janice did a good job setting expectations before and after the ride. Members were considerate of others, and many offered suggestions and asked questions to make sure everyone was safe. Despite the variety and both horse and rider

skills, the group was cohesive and respectful of each other. After the ride, Rich and I learned from staff members at GRR that each rider must sign a waiver to ride on GRR property. Also as we discussed, if members want to use the arenas or other GRR facilities they must have a vaccination record for each horse. Live and learn - next time we will be better prepared.

Thank you, Janice, for being our trail boss, and thanks to all 24 members who put up with the bumpy ride through Manhattan to get to GRR and making the day a great one!


The rest of the meeting was spent discussing our Poker Ride committee report.
